College Report 2021-22

On this pandemic situation, I can say *Great deeds come from the times of shortage*. I like to present it, the 27th annual report of the college activities during 2021–22. The academic year began on 1st June 2021 and the classes were conducted in the online mode till October. On that day Dr Binu P Chacko took charge as Principal and Dr Simi Varghese as the Vice Principal of the college. Our college is run by the Prajyoti Niketan Christian Charitable Society under the able leadership of Founder Director & Manager Dr Fr Harshajan Pazhayattil. Currently the college is offering 5 UG, 2 PG and a doctoral programme in Psychology. Apart from these, various certificate courses and Bridge courses were also conducted this year. First batch M.Sc Computer Science (Data Analytics) students are completing their programme this academic year. We have completed the renovation of Data Analytics lab with a funding from RUSA. The Management contributed 26 computers to two computer science labs and also constructed a recording studio. A generator of capacity 30 KVA was also supplied by the management during this period.

1. Staff & Students

There are 34 teaching staff and 17 non-teaching staff working in the college. Four assistant professors and a librarian were appointed this year. Ms Ceena Mathews, Dr Binu P Chacko and Dr Mary Paul completed 25 years of service in this college. The student strength of the college is 674 including 481 girls.

2. Library

We have a fully web-based library with 17,145 books and 31 periodicals. The facilities such as browsing, e-book reader, NLIST, etc. are available in the library. This year we have also formed NDLI club and conducted programmes in association with IIT Kharagpur.

8. Departmental Activities
